### **POLICY FOR CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY**

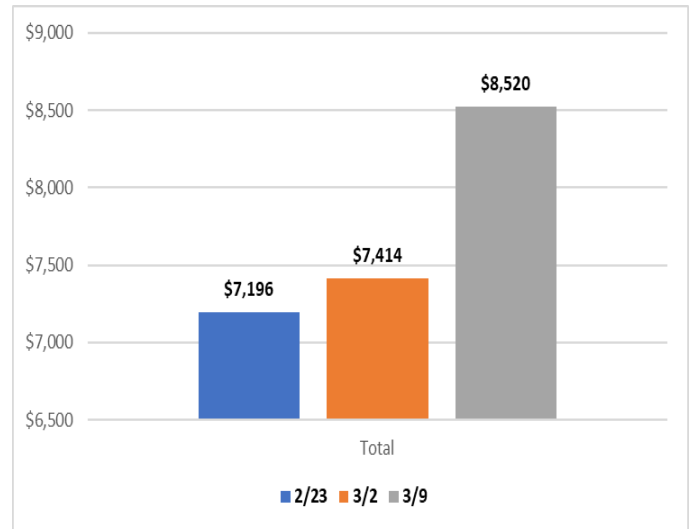

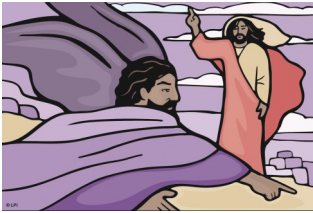

We will stay caught up in an endless cycle of excuses that lead us nowhere. That is unless we simply choose to stop the madness and say YES! This Lent, give up and give in. Let God take over as you surrender all you are and have to Him. Now is the time to turn to Jesus.

### USING LENT TO FIND OUR LIFE PURPOSE

*"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, you shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets." (Matthew 22:37)*

As we enter the season of Lent we need to think about the purpose of the ancient Lenten practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Alms Giving. Making more time for prayer, fasting as giving up some material pleasure, & actively developing a greater awareness of the needs of other people & actively being more generous, are requirements of our faith. As intelligent, responsible people we need to always think about why we do what we do. The Church's Lenten disciplines are about finding & living our life purpose. God has a plan for the life of every human being. That plan is unique for each individual but always involves our relationships.

Strong relationships require being present & communicating. How we live our human relationships reflects our relationship with God. We go to Mass to be in the presence of God. The Eucharist is Jesus Christ. Relationships also require communication. God speaks to us in the words of Sacred Scripture & Church teaching. Our prayer time is an opportunity to ask God, & ourselves, am I seeking that Word, do I believe that Word, am I living that Word? Receiving Communion is a public answer of YES, to that question. Real relationships require honesty. The sacrament of Confession is a direct encounter with God but is also about honesty. God not only gives us sure direction in life, but also is here with us to help us live His plan. That plan is always about our relationship with God & is reflected in our relationships with other people. That means being generous. That is Alms Giving. Effective Alms Giving is always sacrificial. That means inconveniencing ourselves.

The most important things we have accomplished in life were not only inconvenient, but usually downright difficult. The measure of the value of our accomplishments is their positive impact on the lives of others. Lent is a time to reevaluate the purpose and meaning of our lives. Prayer, Fasting, & Alms Giving are tools God has given us for that. When we embrace these tools with energy and honesty we find meaning and purpose. We need to honestly accept the possibility that we could be doing better. We need to keep the goal in sight, love of God & love of neighbor.

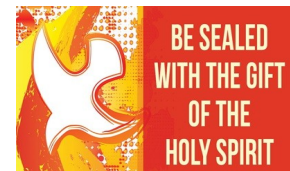

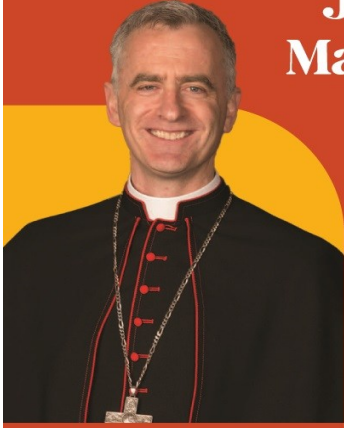
